Science challenge

Challenge description	How to enter and the deadline
<p>How to make ice decorations</p> <p>You will need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Saucers Kettle Boiled water that has been allowed to cool Natural items like leaves, feathers, berries and grass String or wool A freezer (if the weather isn't cold enough!) <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Place your saucers on a flat surface and put the end of your string into the saucer, making sure a long piece is left dangling over the edge. Lay natural items in the saucer over the string. Gently pour in cooled water (boiling it first helps to remove any bubbles). Put the saucers outside on a frosty night (or in the freezer). In the morning put the saucers in a tub of cold water to separate the ice.
