Message from the Headteacher

As the academic year of 2019/20 draws to a close, it would be fair to say that it has been completely unprecedented and nothing any of us could have foreseen or planned for.

When we received notice of our Ofsted Inspection in March, we were already having notifications from the DfE that lockdown would be fast approaching. Staff and students, as I have said many times before were a credit to themselves and our school and our Ofsted report highlights the excellent work we do, the relationships we look to foster through our pastoral care and the experiences we look to bring to our students. I am immensely proud of what we have achieved, together and the many comments on parent view, confirm what a great school we have.

I wanted to say a special thank you to all of our students, who have had to make adjustments to the way they have been working. The work that our students have carried out has been excellent and what I have been so impressed with, is the way our students have engaged with all the extracurricular challenges from all departments. A huge thank you to all of you!

Our plans to move from our vertical tutor structure to horizontal year group come at a time when it would have been impossible to maintain a mixed year tutor group under the current Covid19 guidelines for schools. All Year 7,8 and 9 students had their Academic Review Day meeting with their new tutor this week and that has been important in understanding the work that they have achieved and what the year ahead will look like to them. More importantly the sessions hopefully reassured them, that when we return in September, it will be full time with full access to the curriculum and that they will continue to be supported.

Our September Covid Risk Assessment has been shared with staff, governors and trustees and we will share it with Parent Forum tonight. We have put in comprehensive measures to ensure that we can come back 100% full time with normal lessons as possible. The Risk Assessment will be available on our website from Friday 17th July but please be aware it will continue to evolve as the guidance changes.

A separate communications relating to the specific arrangements for September will be sent to all parents and carers on Friday 17th July. It will outline the changes we have had to make to ensure we adhere, were practicable, to the DfE and Public Health England guidelines but I am confident that once we get through the initial few weeks of school, things will get back to some resemblance of normality.

Year teams, Progress Leaders and support staff are ready for September and we are excited to welcome our students back. We will need your support to ensure all the normal routines of behaviour, uniform, class



work and our core values are followed, with wellbeing being at the heart of them.



Our class of 2020, Year 11, will collect their examination results on August 20th. I would like to acknowledge what a challenging year they have had. We are committed to ensuring that all Year 11 are able to progress onto the next part of their educational journey, be it college, apprenticeship etc. and have continued to provide information and guidance to them all during the lock-down period.

I look forward to seeing them on results day and sharing their excitement and success at every level. We have postponed our prom, as the current guidance does not allow us to progress. But we will ensure that Year 11 have an opportunity to celebrate later in the year.

Our new Year 6 – Year 7 transition event was held virtually this year and we appreciate it is not the way we would have liked to showcase our school. Year 6 have had only the opportunity to meet their Tutors through the videos we have been issuing. Hopefully our online delivery has provided all the salient points you needed answers to and hopefully conveyed how excited we are to have them join our school. We look forward to their first day in school on Monday 7th September which is just for Year 7. All other year groups will follow, with the whole school in from Tuesday 8th September.

All our year groups will have staggered start and departure times and specific social areas/lunch areas in the school. This will help with us try to maintain our year group bubbles. As with all of our extensive plans and risk assessments, the Trustees have to plan for what we can realistically do and what is practicable.

Our plans are workable and deliverable as we go fully operational from Wednesday 9th with normal lessons. If things need to change, then we will obviously communicate this with you, I will do this via the parent meetings we have set up in the first 2 weeks of term, and also via our parent newsletter that you receive weekly.

There will be lots of information that you will have been sent and I ask you to carefully read and digest it and ensure that your child is fully aware of where they need to be and how they will access the school. If you have any concerns please use our covid19@worthinghigh.net email address as this continues to be monitored over the summer and once we return all communication should return to normal staff and the main office team.

Finally, from myself, a moment of reflection; when I started in January 2017 the school was on a journey. What we have been able to do over the last 3 years is ensure we do not lose sight of what is important and help our students leave school with a great set of core values, academic qualifications and be able to be confident individuals in our ever changing world.

I am so very proud of my staff and students and yourself as parents, in how we have all tried to support each other and get through this challenging year. I look forward to a summer break for all of us, ready to start the new academic year energised and committed to providing the very best education for our students at Worthing High School.

Thank you for your continued and valued support.

We will ensure our final version is shared with parents and carers before the start of term.

Worthing High School is celebrating following a highly successful Ofsted inspection. Back in March 2020, just before all school went into lockdown due to the Covid19 outbreak.




We will be inviting all parents and carers into school for welcome evenings.



Uniform ordering for September

Every Friday from 19th June (between 9am and 12 noon, up until the end of term, except Inset Day on 26th June) students can call the LRC on the following number 01903 229294 and request any books they would like to take out on loan. Library staff will then see if the book is in stock and issue to the student. If the book is available, you will be given a time to come and collect the book from reception on that day. This will be between 1pm and 3pm.

The books will then be placed for collection in reception. The covers will have been sprayed with antibacterial spray before being issued but we advise they are left in the book bag for 72 hours before reading. Please can we ask that students place any books they wish to return in the book box that will also be in reception.

There should only be **one person in reception at a time**, should there already be somebody in reception, please wait outside until that person leaves before you enter the building. **SWI/Banner** have been working hard to ensure they are ready for the busy back to school period.

During lockdown they have continued to service all orders as normal with a reduced workforce. Over the last two months they have worked tirelessly to overhaul our operational procedures to enable our teams to return to work safely and ensure we are Covid-19 secure throughout our entire operation.


