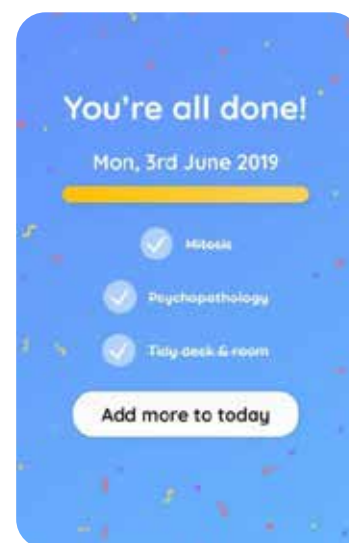
Year 11 Exams

The project was launched earlier on this month with a visit from Ian Rose one of Great Britain's most successful Paralympic Judoka - winner of two Paralympic medals, five World Championship and nine European Championship medals. Ian Rose

**Paralympic Silver Medallist
Four times European Champion**

Ian was born with childhood eye cancer (retinoblastoma) and lost his left eye and most of the sight in his right. After many operations Ian was left with a facial disfigurement and had to wear thick glasses.

At the age of seven, Ian's self-esteem was low and he was often teased at school about his appearance. His parents introduced him to Judo in order to help boost his confidence. Within three months of taking up the sport he had an improved sense of self-belief and was a much more determined individual.

Although not immediately talented at Judo, Ian worked very hard in training and had a real passion to succeed. After two years he won his first medal. His determination and perseverance paid off and he received his first international selection in 1989 whilst still in his last year at secondary school.

He competed at the European Visually Impaired Championships, and for Ian this was a dream come true and the beginning of his international sporting career. He went on to win two Paralympic medals, 5 World Championships medals and four European Championships.

Ian was hoping to represent Paralympics GB at his 6th Games in London but an injury forced him into early retirement in 2011 after a 22 year international career. As one of Great Britain's most successful Paralympic Judoka, Ian was a torchbearer and opening ceremony performer for the London 2012 Paralympic Games.

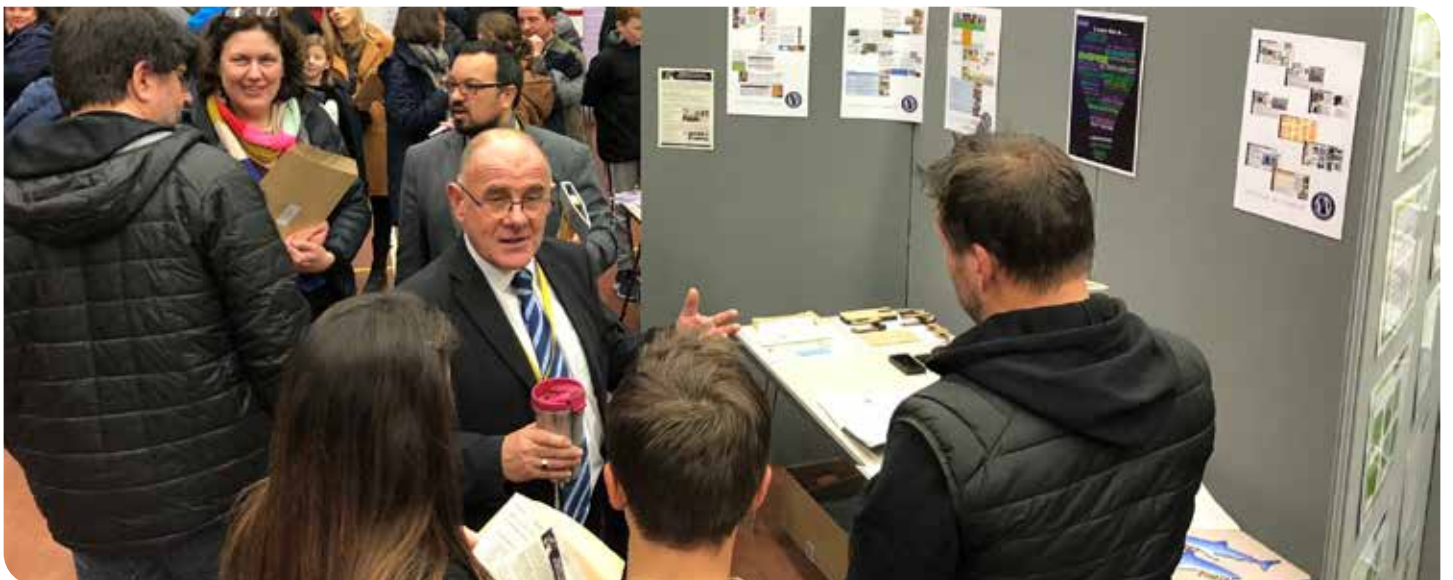
On his role as an Athlete Mentor, Ian commented, **"It is important to set life goals for yourself and to have something to strive for and I am looking forward to helping the students I meet and inspiring them to achieve their full potential."**

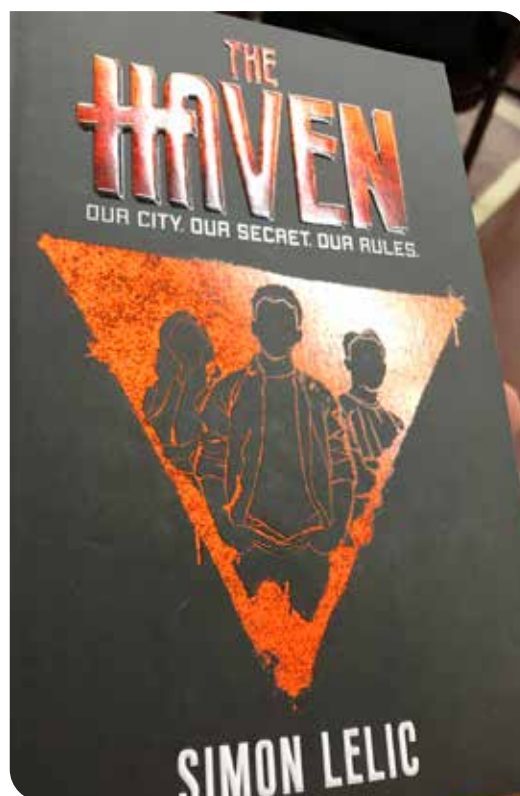
The Haven series of books

Simon has written many books for adults and the Haven was his first venture into children's books. He got the inspiration from his two sons and he runs his draft chapters past them first to see if they approve.

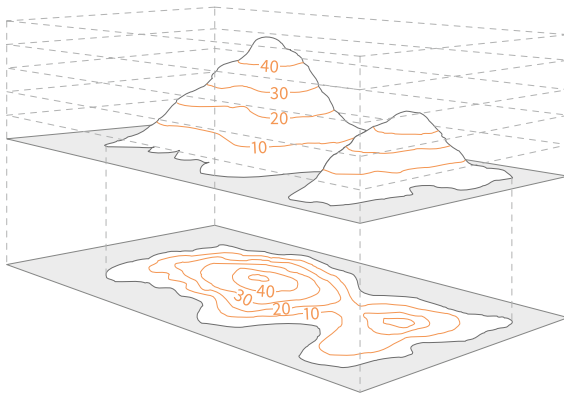

Map reading Fundamentals



The picture shown illustrates how a landscape can be converted into contour lines on a map. An easy way to understand and visualise contour lines is to think of them as high tide lines that would be left by the sea. As the water level drops it would leave a line every 10 metres on the landscape. These marks would be contour lines.

As part of our Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award we have been taking the opportunity of some good weather to practice our navigation skills on the South Downs.

Students have been working in groups to plan their own routes and understand how to use their surroundings to help them navigate. Some particular highlights included saying hello to some sheep and admiring the beautiful view across to Arundel.

Training has been going well and students will now be working in their expedition teams without direct supervision from the leaders as they become more independent.

Our next big expedition will be Friday 8 to Sunday 10 May 2020 (Group A and B practice expedition) at Washington.

New Age Kurling tournament



Our students represented the school in a New Age Kurling tournament against Davison, Shoreham, Oak Grove and Angmering schools.

Kurling is one of the adaptations of original sports, it is played indoors on any smooth, flat surface, such as a sports hall, rather than on ice.

Importantly, the game can be played by both able-bodied and disabled people of all ages alike.

How is New Age Kurling played?

New Age Kurling is a sport that requires participants to deliver 'stones' from one end of the court to a target at the other end of the court. The target has red, white and blue concentric circles and scoring is determined by the number of stones closest to the centre of this target. Each game normally consists of 6 or 8 ends and is played on a court based on half the width of a standard size badminton court with each end being played in the opposite direction to the previous end. The winner is the player with the highest number of scoring 'stones' at the finish of the game.
