# 1. Update - Autumn Term Welcome Evenings for parents

These will take place in the first 2 weeks of the new academic year and will run between 6pm and 7pm on the following dates:

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Year 7 – 7<sup>th</sup> September – Welcome to Worthing High School
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**Year 11** – 8<sup>th</sup> September – *Getting ready for exams* 

Year 10 – 9th September – Welcome to Key Stage 4

Year 8 – 14<sup>th</sup> September - Welcome to Year 8

**Year 9** – 15<sup>th</sup> September – Welcome to year 9

Due to the current Government guidance on large group meetings, we are going to make a slight change to the planned programme. We will email all parents & carers tomorrow with your personal timed entry slot for the evenings above.

# 2. Face Coverings (note 1)

We are aware that there are varying arrangements across schools in the locality. As a school we are, as the guidance stands, not currently recommending students wear a face covering in school. There are a number of factors that are associated with safe and hygienic use of face coverings that we have listed below.

- 1) There are a number of protocols when wearing masks such as washing hands for 20 seconds before handling the mask and then washing hands for 20 seconds after wearing a mask which is not practicable in a school setting.
- 2) If masks become damp, are reused multiple times without being washed, are handled inappropriately or placed anywhere other than in a sealed plastic bag once they have been worn they may lead to an increase in the transmission rates of COVID-19.
- 3) Students would have to ensure they do not place their mask down leading to the mask being classified as medical waste which would then need to be disposed of in line with Public Health England regulations which is not practicable in our school setting.
- 4) Our risk assessment, approved by Trustees, has been thoroughly prepared in the context of our particular school setting.
- 5) Making masks optional may lead to students not wearing masks being unlawfully challenged by other students leading to heightened anxiety for those students unable to access a mask.

We will be continuing to follow DfE guidance pertaining to the wearing of masks in our school and hope that you understand the rationale for our current stance. We thank you in advance for

your support in getting our students back into school in the most positive and normal way possible to enable them to focus on their schoolwork and reconnect with their peers.

<u>Note 1 -</u> A face covering is defined by Public Health England as, "something which safely covers the nose and mouth. Face coverings are not classified as PPE (personal protective equipment) which is used in a limited number of settings to protect wearers against hazards and risks, such as surgical masks or respirators used in medical and industrial settings".

### 3. Tutor Rooms

To assist the smooth entry of Year 8-11 students into school on their first day please find below the locations of each Tutor Group room. Please can you ensure your son/daughter knows which classroom they are going to on their first day. Please see table below which is also attached to this email.
