I know they are already looking forward to spending the £1,000 prize money.

### **EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

In line with guidance from the Department for Education we are currently running a reduced extra-curricular provision on a temporary basis during the current lockdown. Under the current guidance extra-curricular clubs are only allowed to operate "in order to enable parents to work, seek work, or to undertake education or training, and for the purposes of respite care (for vulnerable children)." We are continuing to open the LRC for students who meet this criteria to allow them to be on the school site from 8 am to 5 pm to complete independent study or reading.

Period 0 and Period 6 intervention sessions are continuing to run for our year 11 students as they form part of our core curriculum provision.

We are working hard to ensure that our extra-curricular provision can be expanded as soon as guidance from the Department for Education changes, including plans for intercommunity sports competitions. We will update you with any changes as soon as possible.

### LOCKDOWN AND EMERGENCY EVACUATION DRILLS

Earlier this week, we completed our termly Lockdown Drill where we practice "locking down" the whole of the school. We have been completing this drill for several years now and arrange a drill each term. Our Lockdown process is used in case we experience an incident where students and staff are required to stay "locked in" classrooms/and/or a place of safety until otherwise instructed. Our students managed the process very well. Text messages and emails were sent to all parents/carers at the start and end of the process so that you knew why we may not be answering the phone/emails during the 15 minute drill period. In addition, we also practice Emergency Evacuation each term which might be needed in the case of say a fire occurring. This drill was practiced before October half term.

### 'STEAM'ing ahead!

A national competition saw over 28,500 entries for Tomorrow's Engineers Big Quiz. The quiz promoted STEAM subjects and offered a small glimpse of amazing career options offered through these subjects. We are pleased to announce that Worthing High managed to get the £1000 first prize!! This is a fantastic result and we would like to congratulate all of our amazing students for their fantastic efforts and all of our fantastic Science, Technology, Art and Maths teachers for consistently promoting STEAM.

As part of the various STEAM clubs, the kit will be available for students to use over lunchtimes and allows students to dabble in robotics.
