Dear Parents and Carers,

I always seem to start my message to parents and carers with a thank you and this one at the end of a very testing year is no different. Thank you for all your support with how we have had to operate with our return and as I have said many times before, it is also a huge thanks to the staff at Worthing High School that make it possible.

We have had to implement our remote teaching for those students and staff who have had to self-isolate, this has been kept to a minimum and again largely due to our ability to respond effectively and track and trace. Our vigilance will continue and as and when cases arise we will communicate accordingly.

You may also be aware that from January, rapid-result tests will be provided to schools and colleges, starting with secondary schools and FE colleges, including special schools and alternative provision:

- for the school and college workforce to conduct weekly testing this will help identify those who are carrying the virus without displaying symptoms, reducing the risk of transmission.
- for students and pupils as well as the school and college workforce to conduct daily testing for those identified as close contacts of workforce colleagues, students or pupils that have tested positive – this ensures that they do not need to isolate and are able to continue to benefit from high quality, face to face education.

For every group, testing is voluntary, but those who are eligible for tests are strongly encouraged to participate to reduce the risk of transmission within schools and colleges.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Many thanks to those parents and carers that have supported us with our uniform adjustments this term. Please may I remind parents of the following to avoid any issues on our return:

- Haircuts should not be extreme (less than grade 2) and should be of a natural colour – if students wish to dye their hair over the holidays, please ensure it can be washed out for their return
- Piercings facial piercings are not encouraged as students are not allowed more than a single stud in each ear lobe and if students have facial piercings they will need to be removed and sanctions will be given if this is not done.
- 3) PE kit please can we remind you that tracksuit trousers should be black and students are not allowed to wear sweatshirts and hoodies as part of their PE kit. They should be wearing the new WHS training top (or fleece/rugby shirt for students in years 8-11).
- 4) Hoodies and sweatshirts are not allowed in school, students should be encouraged to wear an appropriate coat (especially on wet and cold days) and these should be stored in bags or lockers.
- 5) Shoes students should not be wearing trainers in place of school shoes and school shoes should be formal (with a discernible heel) as outlined in our Uniform policy.

HOME LEARNING

All homework is set on Satchel One (new name for Show My Homework). All students and parents / carers have access to this platform via personal login details.

During the coronavirus pandemic, on a temporary basis, we are uploading a copy of lesson work to Microsoft Teams to allow students who are isolating the chance to keep up to date with their work. This may be the PowerPoint for the lesson, or it may be a list of tasks closely related to the work taking place in the lesson and depends on the nature of the specific subject. This work will be stored in the Files section of each Team that your child is a member of. For some subjects it can be found in the Year Group team as opposed to the individual class.

If we have to move to a model where a year group or year groups are required to work remotely from home, all work will be accessed on Microsoft Teams. Students would be expected to follow their timetable and log on to the relevant Team for the lesson timetabled for that particular period. Students would be required to join the Live Meet on Microsoft Teams and their teacher would take a register, introduce the lesson and direct them to any tasks and resources as appropriate. All students have been made aware of this expectation by their form tutor and have a sticker outlining the process in their planner.
