
Create a book character out of any vegetable. They will be judged and the winning entry will get a £10 Amazon voucher.




It's back and time to vote for the books you would like to read.

























Mrs Langley's Book of the Month

Click and Collect Book Loans



Please note that you can only collect your books on a Monday afternoon from reception. Please enter reception and go to the left seating area. Your books will be placed in a bag and labelled with your name. Remember that there should only be one person in reception at a time. We are also providing a delivery service for those students who can't come in to school.

A book return box will also be placed in reception for you to return your current reads when you collect.

You can search for books on the library Web App page. Please don't request a book via the Web App, email us on <u>LRC@worthinghigh.net</u>. Can you also make sure when searching for books that it shows as available and not out on loan. If it is on loan and you still want it email and ask for us to reserve it for you when it comes back in.






New Additions
