



TRANSITION FROM YEAR 6 TO YEAR 7



Transition to Worthing High School is a fundamental part of your child's progression. Our Progress Leader, Mr Townsend liaises with all feeder schools throughout the year. Your child will meet Mr Townsend during an assembly this term.

If you choose Worthing High, you will have an opportunity during the year to inform us about your child. This will be in addition to a detailed meeting between your child's class teacher, Mr Townsend and our Pastoral Leaders to discuss all aspects of learning and support.

Year 6 'Transition days' will occur during June/July 2023. Individual tailored visits to Worthing High School can be arranged, where extra support is needed.

2023 SUMMER SCHOOL

Worthing High run an annual Transition Summer School in August. It is a fantastic opportunity for new Year 7 students to find their way around the school, make new friends and develop key team building and problem solving skills, all whilst having a great time.

During the week, the children will take part in a vast range of enrichment activities including school orientation, problem solving, drama, art, cooking and many more. They will also participate in discussion sessions to help support their transition to secondary school.







UNDERSTANDING THE PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

PROGRESS

For the past two years, Worthing High School students have made outstanding progress. On average, a Worthing High School student will achieve around one third of a grade better than the National expectation.

This means, students attending Worthing High School are more likely to be accepted into their first choice college, apprenticeship or training destination.

Progress 8:

This measure shows how much progress Worthing High students make by the end of Key Stage 4. A score of zero indicates they are achieving the national progress target, as set by the Government. Any score above zero indicates they are doing better than expected.

Attainment 8:

This measure shows the average total points scored by students for the 8 subjects they have done best in, including English and Maths. Each subject is graded 1—9 with English and Maths double counted.

Percentage of pupils achieving the English Baccalaureate:

This measure shows the percentage of students achieving a 5+ or 4+ in English, Maths, two Sciences, a Language and either History or Geography.

Why grades 4 and 5?

The Government has set grade 4 as a 'standard pass' and grade 5 as a 'good pass.'

Why 8?

To ensure students receive a broad and balanced education, the Government encourages all students to study at least 8 subjects.

Our Admissions Policy

Worthing High School is a 11-16 mixed comprehensive school and one of five secondary schools in the town of Worthing.

We became an Academy on 1 December 2012 and have a non selective policy.

The main principle of admission to Worthing High School is to maintain the character of the school as a comprehensive school with a calm and purposeful learning ethos, providing for the needs of young persons within the 11-16 age range, who live in Worthing and the surrounding areas.

There is no guarantee of a place for children living in this area in the case of oversubscription.

We are an inclusive school with a family feel and welcome all applications. Our uniform policy is intended to encourage a professional appearance and a pride in the school. We have tried to keep this at a reasonable cost while maintaining a level of conformity and are pleased to discuss any concerns you may have about uniform items.

Admission to our school is not dependent on any voluntary contribution and we have a full range of extra-curricular activities available for all students at no cost. We also have a full programme of both residential and non residential visits for which a charge is made but again are pleased to discuss any concerns you may have.

- Pupils will be admitted at the age of 11+ without reference to ability or aptitude.
- The admission number for September 2023 will be 210 for any year group.
- Mid year admissions into Years 8,9,10 and 11 will be dealt with in accordance with this policy.


