

#### SCHOOL NEWS 20 APRIL 2023

**Dear Parents and Carers** 

Welcome back to the Summer Term, I hope you have enjoyed the Easter break and students return rested and ready for another busy term. There is a huge amount to look forward to this term and we hope that students immerse themselves in the numerous extracurricular opportunities we have. It is so nice to see students outside of the classroom environment and pursuing interests and passions. Tonight, the school will be hosting its 10<sup>th</sup> Simply Dance Show and first since Covid disruption, we look forward to welcoming parents, carers and their families to watch our amazing dancers, from across the school.

As many of you will be aware, there has still not been a resolution between the Teaching Unions and the Government over the ongoing dispute regarding pay and conditions. As a result, the Unions have now confirmed two further days of industrial action on 27<sup>th</sup> April and 2<sup>nd</sup> May.

Unfortunately, on 27<sup>th</sup> April we have again had to make the difficult decision to partially close the school to Years 7, 8, 9 and 10. The school will only be open to vulnerable students and Year 11, as we support them in this crucial period leading up to their exams. There will also be changes to the school day on 2<sup>nd</sup> May, but we will confirm details of this as soon as we can. We apologise for the disruption this will cause and thank parents, carers and students for their understanding and kindness throughout this period.

Details of how to access work from home will be shared with students, parents and carers nearer the time.

Students have returned to school positively and have had an excellent first week back. For our Year 11's, GCSE's are just weeks away and a number of Non Examined Assessments, speaking exams and course work modules have already been completed – these all count towards final grades and we are very proud the approach students have taken. This is a stressful time and we fully appreciate the challenges they will face. If you have worries or need support, please do contact Mrs Riches, their pastoral leader. To help them prepare as best they can, we also strongly urge them to attend Period 0/6 interventions – these sessions will have impact, even with such short amount of time left in school. We have identified some students who will receive specific invites to sessions, please do ensure they attend if this is the case. Invites will be shared next week.

Finally, there are a few uniform reminders below, please can you ensure you have read these and your child is sent into school in the appropriate uniform.

### Consultation on extending the school Day

The Department for Education has set out its expectation that the total hours spent in school is set at 32.5 hours per week. Our current hours total 32.08 hours, giving us a weekly shortfall of 25 minutes. This means, we need to add 5 minutes to each school day. Our priority is to make a change that positively impacts the education of our students, therefore, we are looking to extend Period 5 by five minutes.

Consultation has already taken place with staff, Governors and Trustees and it was felt this model would add most value because currently Period 5 consists of 10 minute Drop Everything and Read (DEAR) time, meaning curriculum time during this period is reduced to 50 minutes. Adding an additional 5 minutes will mean, curriculum time is increased to 55 minutes and subjects taught during Period 5 will not lose as much teaching time.

This will mean the school day will finish at 15:10 and no other timings of the day will be impacted:

8:40 – Registration/Assembly

9:00 – Period 1

10:05 – Period 2

11:05 – Break

11:25 – Period 3

12:30 - Period 4

13:30 - lunch

14:00 – end of lunch

14:05 – Period 5

15:10 - End of school day
