Dear parents and carers,

What a week to come back! Many of you will have seen the media reports of the issue of RAAC in schools, and the challenges in managing that will no doubt continue for many schools. It does not impact our schools at Worthing High School or Clapham and Patching C of E Primary School, and is something we are continually monitoring and reviewing, to ensure all of our staff and students are safe.

The return back is always challenging and that coupled with a mini heat wave doesn't help, but our school has done incredibly well. Fortunately, the temperature returns to more 'normal' ranges next week and we thank you for your patience and understanding during this time.

Our GCSE results from our outgoing class of 2023 were very positive and we are very proud of how well all our students achieved at every level. We wish them all the very best in their next endeavours and look forward to celebrating their success in the future.

One thing is clear, students whose attendance is strong 95% + do well and the data nationally reinforces that. Attendance continues to be a focus and our expectation is that every child is in school, learning every day. We appreciate there will always be medical appointments etc., but we strongly encourage optional appointments to be made at the end of school day where possible to help the continuation of learning in the classroom.

Many parents have also noted the new school calming traffic signs on South Farm Road. This is a great addition and one that we have, especially Mrs Gannaway, been pursuing for many years. Our focus is still to try and have some form of safe crossing in St Lawrence Road and hope that you will continue to support our efforts in achieving this.

With safety in mind, it is also excellent to see so many of our students coming to school on bike/scooters etc. Our policy is still the same and when they cycle to school, they must also cycle wearing a cycle helmet. If they are challenged by staff on duty if they do not have a helmet then we will inform you as parents and carers, and if they cannot produce a cycle helmet they will not be allowed to cycle to school. The roads around Worthing High School are exceptionally busy in mornings and afternoons, and we are trying to keep your child safe.

Our Welcome Evenings for your specific year groups have begun and are on our school website, with our first evening for year 7 taking place yesterday. We look forward to meeting you all and providing key information relevant to your child's year group.

Finally, we are holding our Open Day event on Saturday 23 September at 9-1pm, for years 6 students and their families, with Open Morning tours taking place on Monday 25- Friday 29 September. This information has been sent out to all local schools and will be on our website.

Year 11 mocks

In order to ensure the Year 11s make the best possible progress in this final year, they will be sitting two sets of mock examinations; the first will be fortnight beginning 30 October. We appreciate these are early in the year, but we are confident this is the best time to conduct them. Previous Year 11 groups have shown that doing them early gives plenty of time to work on any gaps in knowledge and skills and for teachers to ensure their support for the students is tailored and impactful. To support students in their preparation, please do encourage your child to start revising at home and prepare as well as they can. All of our subjects have a Google Site, which has revision material and teachers will be sharing websites and resources to help. There will be additional support in school with intervention/revision sessions running before and after school – a timetable of these



sessions will be shared shortly. Again, we recommend you encourage your child to attend these, should they need support in particular subjects.
