Year 7 CATS

Next week, between the 18 and 22 September, all year 7 students will be sitting Cognitive Abilities Tests (CATs). This is part of our induction process and are nothing for students to worry about. We use the outcomes to identify students who might need additional support and to ensure all students have accurate target grades. All tests are sat on computers and do not require any preparation. Your child's tutor will ensure students know the time and location of the tests. Students will receive further information in their assembly on Friday.

Cycle Helmets:

Study Capture Launch

We're very excited to be launching Study Capture next week across all year groups. Starting from Monday 18 September, we're asking students in all Year Groups to spend 5 minutes each day recalling the Key take-aways and Keywords from each lesson. This study technique is based on scientific research and will promote the recall of information, embed knowledge from the day and give students an opportunity to reflect on their learning. This daily routine will eventually become a study habit that will support all students to improve their learning, progress, memory and achievement. Students should complete it at the same time after school each day to help them get into a good routine.

If your child finds this difficult, here are some tips to help trigger their memory:

- Complete it as soon as they get home or even before they leave school in the LRC
- Check their timetable to remind them what lessons they had
- Imagine the room they were in and where they were sitting
- Imagine the teacher and what they may have said that lesson
- Check their book if they are still stuck (as a last resort)
- Go and see their teacher or tutor if they are finding it difficult

All students who are up to date will receive a "Study Capture Merit" every week from their tutor.
