Year 11 Mock examinations

Year 11 students will be sitting mock examinations between Monday 30 October and Friday 10 November (art students will also do their Art exam on 13 and 14 November). All students need to be in school at the normal time, where they will either go to tutor or straight to the Millennium Hall for their first exam. Students not in an exam will go to lessons as normal. Students are permitted to go home after their final exam of the day but they must not leave in between exams. Hear for You: Independent Counselling service that provides 1:1 counselling support. (Charitable donation per session to be negotiated with organisation).

West Sussex Mind: Mental Health Support for 16-25 year olds, including Young Minds, offering 24/7 crisis support. (Free).

SHOUT (85258): (Free) 24/7 mental health text support service.

CGL (Change Grow Live): 1:1 and small group support for those wanting help for their drug and alcohol use (Free).

Safe:Space Sussex: Support for those that may be affected by domestic abuse, sexual or criminal exploitation within the community (Free)
