Dear Parents and Carers,

I will start by congratulating students on their efforts so far this term, it is cold, the days are short and the holidays feel like a distant memory. Still they come to school and apply so much effort in the classrooms, demonstrate so much kindness in the corridor and make our community such a special one. I am delighted to share that we have already had 3500 positive cards returned so far, this academic year, that's more than 10,500 occasions where we have acknowledged a student getting it right and showcasing one of our core values.

I am proud to see our Year 11s role model this core value so well by attending before and after school intervention. Can I ask that parents and carers continue to support us with this and encourage students attend these sessions.

# New Free School Meals (FSM) application process

From **1 January 2024**, there will be a new process for parents to submit their applications for Free School Meals (FSM). The process will be entirely online. The system will give parents an instant indication of their child's FSM eligibility status, with the aim of ensuring eligible children receive their FSM entitlement as quickly as possible, by helping to reduce the time for checks to be returned in busy periods. **Please see attached Booklet.** 

Most parents will be familiar with this new electronic process, as it uses the same portal that parents need to use for their school admissions preferences and/or 2-year-old entitlement checks.

This process, in most cases, allows parents to receive their initial eligibility result instantly. Our Catering Services FSM team will then run further checks and confirm the outcome via email to both the parent and the school.

With the move to online applications fully functional on **1** January **2024**, we will have a one-month transitional period where paper FSM applications will still be processed by the team, to allow schools to communicate the change to their parents, and to ensure no application forms are caught between systems.

From **1 February 2024**, all scanned paper copies of FSM application forms sent to us will not be processed, and the applicant or school will be contacted and advised of the online process.

If a parent is struggling to complete the online form, and the school has been unable to support, please advise them to contact our team directly on **0330 222 5555** or at <a href="mailto:fsm@westsussex.gov.uk">fsm@westsussex.gov.uk</a> Links on the Council website will be updated to take parents to the new online FSM application form as of **1 January 2024**. Until then, the process will remain the same as it is currently.
