Well done to Amelie in Year 10, who competed in the British Gymnastics championships and finished 12th overall. Also, congratulations to Elise, who despite competing against runners **in the year group above**, managed to finish 57th out of 339 participants in the English School's cross-country competition. Finally, well done to Zanthe in Year 8, who has qualified for the All-England Dance group. On the subject of achievement, we would also like to know of any music qualifications that have been obtained outside of school. If your child has sat a level 3 music qualification in **Practical Music, Music Theory, Music Performance, Popular Music Theory, Rock & Pop** or **Theory of Music** and received a grade 6 or higher, we are able to add this to their personal learning record (PLR). The PLR is a permanent online record of your child's qualifications and achievements. It's held by the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA), which is an executive agency of the Department for Education (DfE). Having all qualifications in one space makes future applications to college, university and work much easier. Finally, you will be aware that next week is the last week of term and school breaks up at 3:10 on Thursday 28th March. During the Easter break, we will be running a number of intervention sessions for Year 11. <u>English Bedrock Homework – Year 7 / Year 8</u>

As part of the school's ongoing commitment to evidence-based literacy instruction, we are partnered with literacy improvement specialists **Bedrock Learning**. Built by former English teachers, Bedrock Learning is a digital literacy platform which offers learners a carefully sequenced and adaptive **vocabulary and grammar curriculum**. It exposes learners to new words and grammatical concepts through a rich diet of culturally valuable fiction and nonfiction, and its algorithm ensures that learning is personalised to your child, identifying and targeting gaps in knowledge.

When students engage regularly with the programme, this can be a transformative addition to our literacy offering, ensuring that our young people are equipped with the vocabulary

and grammatical understanding they need to access the curriculum and express their ideas in every subject.

At WHS students in Year 7 and 8 are expected to carry out Bedrock Vocabulary lessons online for homework, to achieve a minimum of 20 points a week. Homework is set on a Monday and is due by the following Sunday. Teachers receive a report on Monday morning to track student engagement and progress. Those who do not achieve the required 20 points will be set an after school detention for the following Tuesday for 30 minutes. This is held in B3, a computer room, to allow them to catch up with their missing homework for English.
